Stories about what we like to eat

Fast food is not very healthy but it's very tasty. Here are some things about some of your favourite types of food.

The hamburger - short history

It got its name from the German town of Hamburg, which was famous for its ground steak. German immigrants to the United States introduced the "hamburger steak". At the Saint Louis World's Fair in 1904, hamburger steaks were served on buns for the first time. Hamburgers on buns were convenient and tasted good. This became the usual way of eating hamburgers. How did the hamburger become the most popular, most typical American food? The introduction of the bun is an important part of the answer. Another important part is McDonald's, the fast-food restaurant. The first McDonald's was opened in San Bernardino, California, in 1949. Hamburgers were the main item on its menu.



The history of the hot dog

Back in 1900 a man was trying to sell sausages in the streets of New York. He boiled them and then kept them hot in a tank of hot water. Nobody was very interested until he started to shout, 'Get your hot dachshund sausages here!'

A dachshund is a long, thin, brown dog which looks something like a sausage. As a result he sold many more of his sausages.

A newspaper reporter took a photograph of the sausage seller holding up one of his sausages for a story in his paper. But he wasn't sure how to spell 'dachshund', so he called it a 'hot dog' instead. And that's how the name started.

The same salesman lent a pair of white gloves to his customers to hold the hot sausages with. But somebody forgot to give him back the gloves. So he went to a baker and asked him to make him some long pieces of bread to hold the hot dog in. This was such a perfect combination that it has remained unchanged ever since. If you go to a baseball game today, you can still see sellers walking around with hot-water tanks. As they walk up and down the rows, they yell, "Get your hot dogs here!"



The story of the sandwich

When John Montagu, the fourth Earl of Sandwich, ordered beef served between slices of bread about 250 years ago he probably did not think his request would become a global convenience meal.

The story goes that the Earl asked for the particular serving so that he could eat while continuing to play cards and his friends asked "to have the same as Sandwich", according to the British Sandwich Association.

The first written record of the sandwich was in 1762 and the Kent town of Sandwich, which is the earldom of the Montagu family, is celebrating the 250th anniversary of the meal.

Sir Edward Montagu, a prominent naval commander, became the first Earl of Sandwich when he was offered a peerage in 1660. Over the weekend the east Kent town hosts sandwich-making competitions and reenactments of the moment the fourth Earl of





Places to visit

The Paleontological Reservation Cozla –

Pietricica – Cernegura from Piatra

Neamţ, Neamţ County

From a geological perspective, the mountains Cozla, Pietricica and Cernegura that surround the town Piatra Neamt represent the last step of the Carpathians and they are located at the intersection between Carpathians and Sub-Carpathians.

In the north part of the town we can see the hill named Cozla with a height of 852 metres, in the east there is Pietricica with a height of 530 metres and on the south there is Cernegura with a height of 679 m.

60 million years ago here there was the bottom of a sea where lived clamps, different species of fish and other organisms specific to this area. This information is confirmed by the numerous fossils discovered. Because of that, these mountains were declared a protected area and became a reservation with a surface of 53 ha.

Many of the fossils discovered in this place can be seen in the Museum of Natural Science from Piatra Neamţ.


