#### What does vocabulary refer to?

Vocabulary is all about words — the words in a language or a special set of words including their structure (morphology), use (grammar), meanings (semantics) and links to other words word/semantic relationships.

Vocabulary refers to all the words that make up a language.

Why is it important to understand vocabulary?

Vocabulary helps express ourselves more precisely and sharpens communication.

Why is vocabulary important in communication?

Vocabulary is very important because it improves all areas of communication . A robust English vocabulary improves overall communication — listening, speaking, reading, writing. Knowing a great number of words can help to express ideas in a meaningful way.

# It's a pronoun that takes the place of a noun as the subject of a sentence.



### Commonly Confused Word: good / well

**Good** is an **adjective** while **well** is an **adverb** answering the question **how**. Sometimes **well** also functions as an adjective pertaining to health.

### **Good** is an adjective. It modifies (describes) a noun.

#### Example





# Well is an adverb. Well always modifies/describes a verb.

# As a modifier of a verb, well tells **HOW** something is done.

Summary **Good** is an **adjective**. It modifies a noun. **Well** is an **adverb**. It modifies a verb (telling "how"). Well may be used as an adjective to indicate good health or satisfactory conditions.

### What is a collocation?

Collocation refers to a relationship between words that frequently occur together.

### Why learn collocations?

Your language will be more natural and more easily understood.

You will have alternative and richer ways of expressing yourself.
